External Professional Reviews

I wanted to share some positive comments from external professionals who have visited our school this term. We regularly have focus visits in school (beyond Ofsted!) to help us evaluate our provision and to learn from other professionals. Professionals carry out a range of activities including observing teaching and learning, looking at books and of course talking to pupils- they will always talk to a broad range of pupils across the school to enable a balanced view of experience.

This term Jean Watt (an HMI inspector) visited to look closely at our history curriculum. She was extremely complimentary about our curriculum and the work in pupil's books, but most of all she was blown away by the children she spoke to about their learning and understanding- especially in the area of chronology.

Three local head teachers also visited our school this half term, focusing upon personal development. They were over the moon with our personal development approach and practice and took many ideas away back to their schools. Below are just some of the wonderful comments:

- A warm, supportive, calm and inclusive ethos permeates DJS and positive relationships abound.
- The school values underpin every aspect of school life. They have evolved into a highly effective moral and ethical framework. This means that children have every chance of succeeding in their next stage of education and beyond.
- Pupil's understanding of the Protected Characteristics and Equalities is very strong and, by Y6, their ability to articulate their views with sensitivity and respect is exceptional.

We are so proud of your wonderful children and the staff in school for all of their hard work in an area that permeates every element of school life!
