community	a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common
society	people living together in a more or less ordered community
Built environment	the human-made surroundings that provide the setting for human activity
poverty	the state of being extremely poor
inequality	difference in size, degree, circumstances
privilege	a special right, advantage, or <u>immunity</u> granted or available only to a particular person or group
debt	a sum of money that is <u>owed</u> or due
earn	obtain (money) in return for labour or services
salary	a fixed regular payment
tax	a <u>compulsory</u> contribution to state revenue
refugees	a person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, <u>persecution</u> , or natural disaster.
Asylum seekers	a person who has left their home country as a political <u>refugee</u> and is seeking <u>asylum</u> in another.
migration	<i>the permanent change of residence by an individual or group</i>
immigrant	the action of coming to live permanently in a foreign country
culture	the ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a particular people or society
religion	a particular system of faith and worship
language	the principal method of human communication
