
What is Propaganda?

Propaganda is any information, ideas, or messages that are spread in order to influence the opinion, emotions, attitudes, or behaviour of a group of people in order to benefit the person spreading the message. It can sometimes be biased or misleading. Propaganda can take many forms, including text, images and videos. It is most commonly used to spread particular political messages and has been used historically during times of conflict.

Today we are look at the role of propaganda in spreading a political message.

Propaganda was used extensively through World War 2 to promote various messages from the government. It is also being used a lot at the moment to spread messages relating to Covid 19.


