20 points

- Make a creative collage of characters from one author or one book series
- Listen to this piece of music and write a story, with new or existing characters, that matches the mood:

15 points

- Write a book (or scene of a book) from the viewpoint of a different character e.g. what would Miss Honey think when

Matilda arrived in her classroom, and when she finally gave her a secure future?

- Create a book inspired snack



10 points

- Download the 'Story Dice' app and use to create your own short narratives – the sillier, the better!
- Create a wanted poster for a character in a book you've read. Include a picture, a description, what they did and a reward

Story Dice

Story Dice is a creative tool to prompt ideas for plot, character, and setting. This idea generator can be used effectively for both written and oral storytelling.

This app can be used with a wide variety of age groups ranging from preschoolers to teenagers.

The user interface is simple enough for ages 3+ to use without any additional instruction. The use of the app doesn't require reading, so it's an ideal tool for using in a preschool story circle (see lesson plans) as well as a general writing prompt for all ages without reading or native language barriers.



5 points

- Design a pet for a book character
- Create a bookmark, of any size or shape, which relates to a book you really enjoyed.
- How many words can you create from the letters in 'World Book Day?' Aim for 15+!
- Draw a map of a setting from a book (e.g. Willy Wonka's chocolate factory, based on information he gives on the tour).
- Think of 10 books with alliteration in their title.
- Create a word search with at least 10 book titles in
- Play the A-Z game with authors/book titles – find an author that has either a first or last name for each letter of the alphabet
- Turn a potato (or other vegetable alternative!) into a book character
