They found lambs, goats and cheese and milk. The men wanted to steal the food but Odysseus said


no, so they lit a fire and waited for the owner to arrive.

Odysseus spent a long time thinking








of how to get out. He saw a big stick and asked his men to make it sharp.

On this island, there lived Cyclops, a one-eyed creature who was as big as a house, with enormous hands and feet and a glaring round eyeball in the middle of his forehead.


One day, a man called Odysseus, who was famous all over the world for his quick mind and his
