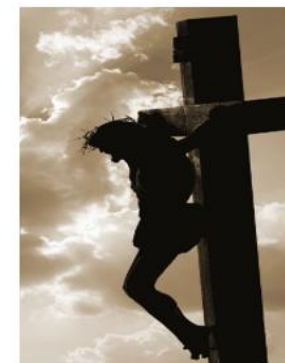
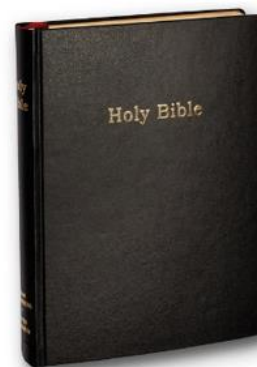


**What I should already know**
