**Key Vocabulary**

<b>Timeline</b>	A way of showing dates in order.
<b>Chronological</b>	In date order.
<b>BC</b>	A time 'Before Christ'
<b>AD</b>	Anno Domini is Latin for "in the year of the Lord" referring to the time after Jesus was born.
<b>Prehistoric</b>	The period before written records
<b>Archaeologist</b>	A person who studies human history and Pre-history by finding and examining evidence.
<b>Evidence</b>	Things that tell us about the past
<b>Hunter</b>	A person who hunts animals for food.
<b>Gatherer</b>	A person who gathers food that grows things.
<b>Agriculture</b>	Agriculture is another word for farming.
<b>Flint stone</b>	A stone used as a tool and to light fires.
<b>Stone circle</b>	Circles made of standing stones. Used for religious ceremonies, meeting places and places to bury the dead.
