Welcome Back!

Dear Parents and Carers

A Happy New Year to you all and I hope you have all managed to have a relaxing break and that COVID didn't interfere too much with any plans you had. We are fully back into the swing of things in school and already on day 2, we have 90+ Year 3 pupils dressed as ancient Greeks- just fabulous!

The main reason for this communication is to update you on COVID. Systems in school remain similar to the autumn term. We are responding regularly and tweaking processes as situations arise, whilst maintaining as much normality as possible. Fortunately, there is a definite intention by the government to keep schools open. I have summarised below the most relevant points from the public health briefing this morning.

Reporting	Please continue to report any positive cases to school. We will continue to keep a record of
positive cases	these. We will report to individual classes and groups if we meet a threshold.
10% positive	 If 10% thresholds are met in school (individual classes, year groups or other small
threshold in a	groups) then we will advise pupils to take LFD testing daily for 7 days. Unfortunately
class or group	we are not able to hand out LFD kits to pupils and families. We recognise there is a
	national shortage and please be reassured that your child can still attend school if you
	are unable to access a test.
	 Pupils who are contacts will not be asked to self-isolate.
	• As we are a mainstream setting we are no longer required to report numbers of cases
	to public health.
Isolation	The updated guidance for schools states the following:
period	• Since Wednesday 22 December, the 10 day self-isolation period for people who
changes	record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 7 days in most
following a	circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason.
positive PCR	• Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period.
test	• Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10
	full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-
	isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. If both these test results are
	negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation
	after the second negative test result and return to your education setting on day 7.
Attendance	If you have one or more children in our school and the first child has tested positive (PCR or
	LFD) the second child should still attend (unless they have symptoms). However we would ask
	that the second child takes daily LFD testing (for 7 days) as they would be considered a close
	contact. If the second child does not attend, but is fit and well then this would be an
	unauthorised absence.
Measures in	Regular handwashing/hand sanitising, good ventilation and staff social distancing remains in
school	place. We have done remote assemblies this week but will return to face to face next week
	but in smaller groups than usual. All events and visits etc that have been planned can
	continue under the current guidance.
Business	It is anticipated that there will be a large increase in cases in all schools nationally. The biggest
Continuity	challenge in the coming weeks for schools (as with other public services) will be staffing. We
Planning	have already been in difficult situations in the autumn term and have continuity plans in
	place; however these will be updated this week in line with local authority guidance and

support. <i>Please be reassured that it remains our priority to keep school open for all pupils</i> <i>and any decisions to close school- either partially or fully will absolutely be as a last resort</i> <i>after all possibilities have been exhausted.</i> With this in mind we would ask you to be patient
during this tricky time as we may need to use strategies such as merging classes, utilising all staff etc in order to maintain face to face education.

I hope the above information is useful and reassures you that we continue to do all we can to manage the pandemic with the minimum impact upon the children as possible.
