Bonfire Night Safety

Bonfire Night can be great fun but it can be very dangerous too. Read through the safety rules below to see how you can stay safe.

How do you stay safe around fireworks?


- Only grown-ups should touch fireworks.
- · Never touch, throw, play with or light them yourself.
- Put your trousers on the outside of your boots to protect yourself.
- Stand well back from any firework that has been lit, even if it hasn't gone off.
- · Always keep pets indoors.

How do you stay safe with sparklers?

- · Always wear gloves when holding sparklers.
- Make sure an adult is with you.
- Put used sparklers in a bucket of water or sand.
- Never touch the lit end of the sparkler.
- Don't wave it close to your face, clothes or other people.

How do you stay safe around bonfires?

- Stand far back from a bonfire, behind a safety fence.
- Never play close to a bonfire.
- Only grown-ups should light the bonfire.

Bonfire Night Safety **Answers**

1. Who should touch fireworks?

Only grown-ups should touch fireworks. Children shouldn't because they can be dangerous.

2. Where should you keep pets during fireworks?

During fireworks, pets should always be kept indoors.

3. What should you wear when holding sparklers?

Always wear gloves (or mittens) when holding sparklers.

4. What does the bucket for used sparklers need to be full of?

The bucket should be full of water or sand.

5. Where should you stand when watching a bonfire?

Stand far back from a bonfire, behind a safety fence.

6. Give one more rule about bonfire safety.

Example: Never play close to a bonfire. Accept any reasonable rule given.





Bonfire Night Safety

Bonfire Night can be great fun but it can also be very dangerous and you have to be careful. Read through the safety rules below to see how you can stay safe.





How do you stay safe around fireworks?

Only grown-ups should touch fireworks. Never touch, throw, play with or light them yourself. Fireworks can hurt you. Put your trousers on the outside of your boots to stop sparks or fireworks from going into your boots. Make sure you stand well back from any firework that has been lit, even if it hasn't gone off. Always keep pets indoors during fireworks.

How do you stay safe with sparklers?

Always wear gloves when holding sparklers and make sure an adult is with you. Put used sparklers in a bucket full of water or sand. Never touch the lighting end of the sparkler when it has been lit or afterwards. Take care with where you are waving the sparkler and make sure it is never close to your face, clothes or other people.

How do you stay safe around bonfires?

Bonfire Night Safety

Bonfire Night can be great fun but the fireworks, sparklers and bonfire can also be very dangerous and have to be treated with care. Read through the safety rules below to see how you can stay safe.

How do you stay safe around fireworks?

Only grown-ups should touch fireworks - you should never touch them, throw them, play with them or light them yourself. Fireworks can be very dangerous and can hurt you. Put your trousers on the outside of your boots or wellingtons to stop stray sparks or fireworks from going into your boots. Make sure you stand well back from firework displays. Never go near a firework that has been lit - even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode. Always keep pets indoors during fireworks, because they can get very scared of the loud bangs.

How do you stay safe with sparklers?

Always wear gloves when holding sparklers and make sure an adult is there to help. Fill a bucket full of water or sand and place the sparklers in the bucket when you have finished with them. Never touch the lighting end of the sparkler when it has been lit or afterwards, even if you think it has gone out. Take care with where you are waving the sparkler and make sure it is never close to your face, clothes or other people.

How do you stay safe around bonfires?

Always make sure you stand far back from a bonfire. Usually there is a safety fence for you to stand behind. Never play close to a bonfire, even if it hasn't been lit yet or if you think it has gone out. Only grown-ups should light the bonfire.

Bonfire Night Safety **Answers**

1. What should be treated with care and why?

You need to treat the fireworks, sparklers and bonfire with care because they can be dangerous.

2. What should you never do with fireworks?

You should never touch, throw play with or light the fireworks yourself.

3. How can you stop stray sparks or fireworks from going into your boots?

You can stop stray sparks or fireworks from going into your boots by putting trousers on the outside of your boots.

4. Why shouldn't you go near a firework that has been lit?

You shouldn't go near a firework that has been lit because it could hurt you and even if it hasn't gone off, it could explode.

5. Where should pets be kept during fireworks and why?

During fireworks, pets should be kept indoors because they can get very scared of the loud bangs.

6. Is it ok to touch the lighting end of the sparkler once it's gone out? Why?

No, it's never ok to touch the lighting end of the sparkler, even if it's gone out because it could hurt you.
