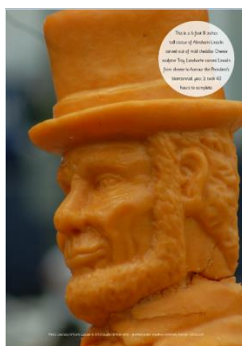
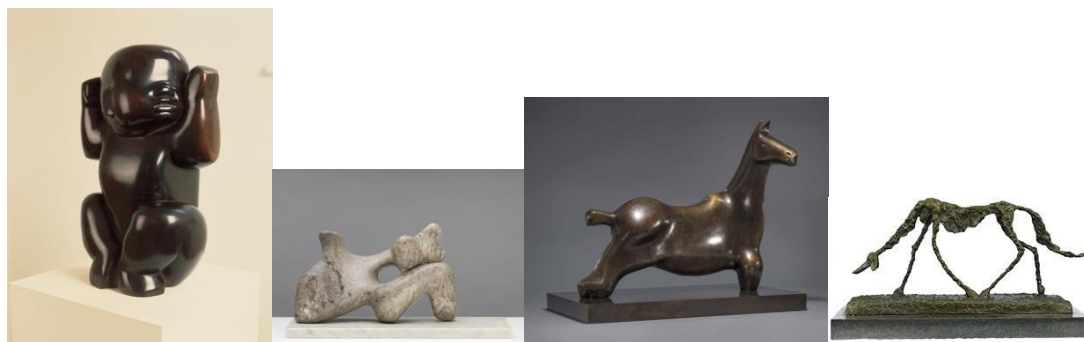

**Key Vocabulary**

form	This can refer to the overall shape made by the sculpture. It can also refer to the shape of individual parts within a work of art.
hue	Hue means both a colour and a shade of a colour. Green is a hue, and turquoise is a hue of both green and blue.
texture	Texture is the physical feel of something — smooth, rough, fuzzy, slimy for example.
materials	The used to create something.
patterns	Something that repeats in a predictable.
sculpture	Three-dimensional art made by one of four basic processes: carving, modelling, casting, constructing.
realism	Artworks created in a realistic almost photographic way.
abstract	Art that does not attempt to look realistic but instead use shapes, colours, forms and gestural marks to achieve its effect.
mould	To shape a material into a specific form.
