What Is Persuasive Writing?



Persuasive writing (which of course could be said aloud) has a very clear purpose: to persuade the reader or listener to agree with what the writer or speaker is saying.

Collecting Features of Persuasive Writing



Persuasive

- Verbs in Wretprgsent tense
- Expressions of conviction (e.g. undoubtedly, obviously)
- Rhetorical questions used to focus the reader
- Reasons for viewpoint
- Title implies a point of view
- Main idea introduced in opening paragraph
- Reasons developed with details, facts and examples
- Opinions presented as facts
- Conclusion which summarises argument
- Strong/emotive/intensifying adjectives
